At one month old, Brayden was diagnosed with a rare genetic disorder called Crigler-Najjar (Type 1) syndrome, an enzyme disease that affects liver function. The only long-term solution was a liver transplant. Unfortunately, Brayden also suffered apparent brain damage from the initial toxic outbreak and spent several days in CHOC's PICU. On July 11, 2019, Brayden had his liver transplant but suffered complications and stopped breathing from an apparent infection. Hospital staff were able to revive Brayden, but he required a second surgery and had to be placed on a ventilator. Brayden is still in the PICU where the hospital continues to try and determine the source of the infection.

Joey and Tabitha have been staying at Children's Hospital of Los Angeles with Brayden while family members are assisting with his four-year-old sister, Sadie, at their home in Anaheim. The Orange Police Department, in partnership with the City of Orange Police Association and Calvary Chapel Old Towne, is hosting a barbecue fundraiser to support the Maciel Family
